JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to firmly establish that money is not political speech, and that human beings, not corporations, are persons entitled to constitutional rights. 2	"Section 1. The rights and privileges protected by the Constitution			
3	of the United States are the rights and privileges of natural persons only.			
4	Artificial legal entities established by the laws of any State, the United			
5	States, or any foreign state shall have no rights and privileges under this			
6	Constitution and are subject to legislative regulation by natural persons,			
7	through Federal, State, and local law.			
8	The rights and privileges of artificial legal entities shall not be construed			
9	to be inherent or inalienable.			
10	"Section 2. Federal, State and local government shall regulate, limit,			
11	or prohibit contributions and expenditures, including a candidate's own
